

## Sports Premium 2024/25

### SPORTS FUNDING

#### Background

In most cases, how many pupils in your school attract the funding is determined using data from the January school census. Schools receive PE and sport premium funding based on the number of pupils in Years 1 to 6.

Schools must spend the funding to improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils, but they are free to choose the best way of using the money.

For example, they can use the funding to:

- hire specialist PE teachers
- hire qualified sports coaches to work with teachers
- provide existing staff with teaching resources to help them teach PE and sport
- support and involve the least active children by running or extending school sports clubs, holiday clubs and Change4Life clubs
- run sport competitions or increase pupils' participation in the School Games
- run sports activities with other schools.

Since September 2013, Ofsted inspections report on how primary schools spend their PE and sport premium funding.

Additionally, schools must publish details of how they spend their PE and sport premium funding on their school's website
