The characteristics of effective learning - how will my child learn?

- At the end of the year your child's teacher will report back to you on your child's learning characteristics
- These characteristics describe how a child learns and focus on the process rather than the outcome:

oplaying and exploring - children investigate and experience things, and 'have a go';

oactive learning - children concentrate and keep on trying if they encounter difficulties, and enjoy achievements;

ocreating and thinking critically - children have and develop their own ideas, make links between ideas, and develop strategies for doing things.



We love to take learning outdoors...



Why outdoor play is essential

- Learning outdoors is different to indoors
- The outdoors is special and unique
- Outdoor play supports all round wellbeing and development
- Many children learn best outdoors



What does Wigginton offer outdoors?

- Stimulating and relevant outdoor provision each day- come rain or shine!
- Weekly Forest School sessions in which we explore learning in our wildlife area and school grounds. Your child will need a pair of named wellies and waterproofs if it is wet!
- OPAL (outdoor play and learning)



Developing a love for reading

- Your child will have two guided reading sessions every week.
- When your child has a second read of their guided book, that is the day they will bring it home along with a free choice book. This will vary so please make sure all books and reading diaries are brought to school each day.
- Your child will be given a green reading diary to record reading at home and at school, it is essential to read at least three times a week at home.

Lunchtime

Lunch is initially from 11:45 - 13:00

There is a large and varied menu which caters for all dietary needs and preferences. Please make sure that the school office is aware of any requirements.

A copy of the dinner menu is available on the school website.

If your child is having a school lunch, they will need to make a choice from the menu - it is best to prep this with them each morning!



Communication

We believe that good communication between staff and parents is key to success!

- We are always on hand in the morning to share a quick message or at the end of the day for a chat.
- You will receive a fortnightly newsletter from the school.
- We use Tapestry to share pictures, school updates and information of what your child has been up to during the day.
- We use Facebook to share regular updates from each phase in school.
- In the first half term, you will be invited to a phonics workshop where you can find out more about how we teach letters and sounds.

Transition Sessions

We have now met most children in outside settings as well as children that attend The Wonder Years. We have loved meeting and seeing all of the children. On Wednesday 1st July and Friday 10th July we invite children to come for a session (both 10:45-11.45). Parents will not be staying for either session. Drop off and pick up will be by the large green gate by the carpark.



Getting Ready for Reception

Help your child with their independence by:

- Getting them to put their coat on and fasten it up
- Getting dressed
- Making sure they are toilet trained
- Buying shoes they can put on by themselves
- Encouraging your child to use cutlery at mealtimes
- Playing games to encourage sharing and turn-taking
- Practising writing their name



Handy tips for the Big Day:

- Your child will need a water bottle in the classroom which has their name on.
- As we spend large amounts of time outdoors each day, please bring appropriate named clothing for the weather (hats, coats, wellies etc.)
- Please ensure your child's book bag is brought into school each day as we will pop any letters, the children's work and their reading books into their bags to take home.
- **For the first five days**, drop off will be on the playground and pick up (at 11.50) will be by the green gate.

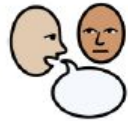

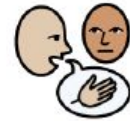
