


My child is well cared for and safe at school.



Behaviour at Wigginton Primary is good.



Wigginton Primary expects children to behave well.




Behaviour is consistently well-managed by staff.


The school has clear routines and expectations for the behaviour of all pupils across all aspects of school life.




My child understands how good behaviour supports good learning.




Bullying and discrimination is dealt with quickly, effectively and consistently.




The school has a positive, respectful culture in which my child is well cared for.


The school has a calm, orderly environment which helps my child to learn.

I fear that bullying and violence is starting to get out of hand, sometimes it's with children with additional needs doing the bullying and violence, I understand this is hard as they maybe don't understand but I feel if they are coming to a main stream school they should be held responsible for their actions , same as any child, and should be delt with in the same way any child would be regardless of needs.

We moved our daughter to this school and we've been really impressed with the difference in behaviour from her previous school. it's clear the importance of it and the level of respect the teachers and children have towards good behaviour

Neutral answers given for some questions where I'm unable to answer if behaviour at school is 'good' or if it's well managed, though there have been occasions where a response to my child has felt punitive and punishing in an attempt to control behaviour (in a way that negatively impacted) rather than understanding what the behaviour was communicating/neurodiversity/an unmet need.

We have been receiving reports from our children of issues of behaviour from other children such as aggression and bullying during break times and for our children being at the receiving end of this they don't go to seek help from a grown up as they are too scared to do so. I think maybe more could be done to help children who do not have the confidence to speak up to find a way to do so at school as its an issue that is often brought home and the teachers often are not aware until I speak to them. Teachers have always been quick to deal with the issues when I've raised them so I do think that is something that is working well in the school.

Closer watch on the smaller children who play with the older year groups to make sure the play is not too rough

I'm interested in webinars, I think this is a great suggestion to share ideas and advice \*\*\*\* is always needing support for a range of behaviours any support the school can provide with this is welcomed

Overall, I think the school communicates what is acceptable behaviour very well. The only idea I would add is that more emphasis is also put on respectful behaviour towards personal space and touching/hugging others without permission. As, due to my daughter's small size she does get some unwanted physical behaviour in the playground. That despite her requesting not to have, is not always listened to.

where I have answered neutral , what I mean really is 'I don't know' as my child has not experienced bullying, discrimination or never spoken to about poor behaviour so I feel I cannot comment.

I found it hard to answer as i've not had reason to be concerned about a behaviour issue within reception. I'm sure it is being managed but my child has raised behaviour of one child in Reception. The only concern i've had is my child started repeating a swear word and I asked where he has heard that and he said from this child.

From our child's experiences and from our visits to school, it feels like a very nurturing, safe and happy place to be.
